FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

PROPOSED ANNEXATION OF CAMERON PARK CSD FIRE SERVICES AREA INTO THE EL DORADO HILLS FIRE DEPARTMENT

Q: Why is Cameron Park Community Services District (CPCSD) Fire Services Area being considered for annexation into the El Dorado Hills Fire Department (EDHFD)?

A: The CPCSD* Fire Services Area is being considered for annexation into the EDHFD primarily due to longstanding concerns about the affordability and sustainability of fire protection services within the CPCSD. This parallels the El Dorado County Grand Jury findings, where many fire districts face challenges with inadequate tax revenue and rising costs, which hinder their ability to effectively serve their communities.

Annexation would not only address these financial and operational challenges but also increase operational efficiencies and enhance the depth of resources. The annexation of the CPCSD Fire Services area into EDHFD would benefit from shared expertise, equipment, and personnel, ultimately improving response times and the overall quality of fire protection services available to residents in both communities.ⁱ

*The CPCSD currently provides services within its legally defined area, covering 4,667 acres. These services include fire protection, emergency medical response, parks and recreation, enforcement of covenants, conditions, and restrictions (CC&Rs), lighting and landscaping, solid waste collection, recycling, and weed abatement. However, the jurisdictional boundaries of the Cameron Park Fire Department do not align exactly with those of the CPCSD.

Q: What would annexation mean?

A: Annexation means that the EDHFD would integrate the CPCSD Fire Services area into a single service area, assuming responsibility for providing fire protection, and emergency medical services as well as fire prevention and other related services within the CPCSD's Fire Service Area. Q: What are the benefits of annexation?

A: Annexation of the CPCSD Fire Service Area into EDHFD would provide reciprocal benefits to both agencies. It would enhance operational efficiency, improve emergency response capabilities, and create cost savings by reducing redundancy and consolidating resources. The unified department would ensure consistent service levels, stronger mutual aid, and improved training opportunities, while broadening community outreach and risk reduction efforts. Additionally, it would increase resource availability and provide greater financial stability by sharing costs across a larger tax base, ensuring sustainable funding for future operations and equipment needs.ⁱⁱ

Q: Why is annexation preferable to continuing the current Cooperative Fire Protection Agreement?

A: Since 1996, CPCSD has partnered with CALFIRE through a Cooperative Fire Protection Agreement to provide fire and emergency services. Under this agreement, the CPCSD funds fire and emergency response personnel while retaining ownership of the fire stations and equipment. However, the rising costs associated with this agreement have significantly impacted the CPCSD's ability to allocate sufficient funding for all essential services with limited funding.

Q: Will taxes or fees be increased for CPCSD property owners?

A: No. The citizens of CPCSD will not see any increase to their existing property taxes or benefit assessment as the result of annexation. It should be noted that if CPCSD chooses not to annex with EDHFD and continues contracting with CALFIRE, there is the potential that CPCSD residents would be asked to vote for a tax increase or accept a reduction in CPCSD services.

Q: Upon annexation, will Cameron Park residents have representation on the EDHFD Board?

A: Yes. EDHFD and CPCSD Fire are discussing several options to ensure fair representation for Cameron Park. A formal plan will be finalized during the annexation process.

Q: Would Cameron Park Fire Department be rebranded as El Dorado Hills Fire Department?

A: Preserving the rich history of the Cameron Park FD, EDHFD intends on maintaining the Cameron Park logo on fire stations in recognition of the history of the department. Apparatus assigned to Stations 88 & 89 will have a joint department branding.

Q: Since EDHFD is legally organized as a Water District, will the water rights of CPCSD property owners be impacted?

A: Annexation of CPCSD Fire Service Area into the El Dorado Hills County Water District/ El Dorado Hills Fire Department will have no effect on the water rights of the residents of CPCSD. Cameron Park residents will continue to receive water and wastewater services from the El Dorado Irrigation District.

Q: What will happen to the CALFIRE employees assigned to serve Cameron Park?

A: Firefighters currently staffing the CPCSD Fire Stations are employees of CALFIRE and would be reassigned within CALFIRE. CALFIRE Employees will have the opportunity to interview for open Firefighter/Paramedic positions within EDHFD.

Q: How long will the annexation process take?

A: The steps required by law for annexation require approximately 18 - 24 months.

Q: Will there be public meetings?

A: Yes. EDHFD, CPCSD and county agencies will inform residents of the dates, times and locations of public meetings. The public will have an opportunity to review annexation material and provide comment.

Q: Who reviews and approves the annexation?

A: The El Dorado County Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCo) has responsibility for processing and approving the annexation. The elected boards for both EDHFD and CPCSD must also approve the annexation terms. The El Dorado County Board of Supervisors must approve any reallocation of property tax revenue or other finance sharing arrangement. Link to LAFCO Project Process Flowchart.

Q: How are CPCSD and EDHFD proceeding through the annexation process?

A: The CPCSD formed an ad hoc committee in 2023 to oversee the initial work to investigate annexation. EDHFD stepped forward as a candidate, as did the El Dorado County Fire District. A feasibility report prepared by the CPCSD's consultant, Municipal Management Solutions Principal, Don Ashton, was released in May 2024 that examined the viability of both fire districts. While both fire districts were identified as capable partners, the recommendation was made to pursue annexation with EDHFD. Link to CPCSD Comparative Analysis for Ongoing Fire Protection Services.

The CPCSD ad hoc committee and EDHFD committee are actively meeting to work on the essential items necessary for an agreement and annexation proposal. Their initial five (5) meetings (August 26, September 10, 16, 30, and October 10) laid the groundwork for discussion items, which include:

- Board representation
- Allocation of taxes and revenues
- Weed abatement and prevention service
- Distribution of equipment and property
- Transition plan
- Cost sharing of annexation expenses

Subsequent meetings will focus and finalize the details for a tentative agreement.

Once the committees reach agreement, that proposal will then be brought forward to the boards of both districts for discussion and approval. Should an agreement be approved, the annexation proposal would then move forward into the LAFCO phase of the process.

ENDNOTES

¹ Other considerations for annexation into EDHFD include:

- 1. Specialized Rescue Operations: Our highly trained personnel are equipped and certified to conduct advanced technical rescues, including confined space rescues, high-angle rope rescues, trench and excavation rescues, and static/dynamic water rescues. These specialized teams, such as Rescue 87 (R87), provide critical services beyond the scope of typical mutual aid responses.
- Public Safety Training: The El Dorado Hills Fire Department's Public Safety Training Center offers
 advanced education and certification programs, hosting over 100 courses annually. These
 courses, including but not limited to, All-Risk Command Operations, Wildland Fire Behavior,
 Health and Safety Officer training, and River, lake and flood rescue technician training, benefit
 firefighters and emergency personnel across the state.
- 3. Disaster Preparedness and Community Education: Our department actively engages the community through disaster preparedness workshops, fire prevention education, and outreach programs. We offer specialized educational services tailored to vulnerable populations, including seniors and schools like Oakridge High School's Fire Explorer program.
- 4. Hazard Mitigation and Community Risk Reduction: We provide robust hazard mitigation services, including defensible space inspections, wildfire risk reduction programs, and participation in community planning initiatives to minimize fire risk and promote safety.
- 5. Collaboration with Local Partners: Beyond the framework of mutual aid, the El Dorado Hills Fire Department collaborates with regional and local agencies like the El Dorado Irrigation District, Los Rios Community College District, and neighboring fire departments (such as Folsom Fire Department) to deliver enhanced services, emergency response training, and public safety initiatives.
- 6. Fleet and Equipment Resources: In addition to mutual aid commitments, our department maintains a fleet of specialized vehicles, including the Battalion 85 Command Unit and other advanced apparatus. These assets are critical for large-scale incidents and extend the capabilities of response teams during local, state, or regional emergencies.

- 1. **Improved Efficiency**: Consolidating resources can streamline operations, reduce redundancy, and enhance service delivery.
- Enhanced Response Capabilities: A unified department can strengthen emergency response, providing greater access to personnel, equipment, and specialized teams for larger or more complex incidents.

ⁱⁱ The annexation of the Cameron Park Fire Department into the El Dorado Hills Fire Department could offer numerous key benefits:

- 3. **Cost Savings**: Merging departments may reduce overhead costs, optimizing the use of taxpayer dollars by consolidating training, equipment procurement, and administrative functions.
- 4. **Uniform Service Levels**: Annexation would ensure consistent fire and emergency medical services across the entire area, providing equal levels of protection and response for all residents.
- 5. **Stronger Mutual Aid**: A larger, unified department can offer more robust mutual aid support to neighboring regions, improving regional emergency cooperation.
- 6. **Improved Training and Specialization**: Access to expanded training opportunities and specialized rescue teams would enhance the skill sets of personnel across both areas.
- 7. **Broader Community Outreach**: A larger department could enhance public education, disaster preparedness, and community risk reduction programs, benefiting both Cameron Park and El Dorado Hills residents.
- 8. **Increased Resource Availability**: The combination of departments would provide a greater pool of personnel and equipment, ensuring quicker response times and better coverage during emergencies.
- 9. **Financial Stability**: Annexation can improve financial stability by spreading costs across a larger tax base, reducing the financial burden on individual districts, and creating a more sustainable funding model for future operations and equipment investments.

Overall, the annexation would lead to more efficient, effective, and financially stable fire and emergency services for the community.

September 2024 Report

OVERVIEW

The El Dorado Hills Fire Department, Community Risk Reduction Division (CRRD) continues to see significant residential development and vegetation management program activity throughout the reporting period. Major construction activity continues in the Valley View Eastridge, Promontory, Carson Creek, Ridgeview, and Bass Lake North areas of the District. New project proposals: Community Heath for Independence consisting of 4,162 residential acres and 167 commercial acres, Generations residential subdivision consisting of 379 single-family dwellings, Alto residential subdivision consisting of 23 parcels, Vineyards residential subdivision consisting of 42 parcels, La Canada residential subdivision consisting of 40 parcels, Wildhawk residential subdivision consisting of 70 parcels, Creekside Village residential subdivision consisting of 926 single-family dwellings, Rancho Victoria residential subdivision consisting of 8 40-acre residential parcels, Latrobe Self Storage at Latrobe Rd. and Suncast Lane, Town & Country Village conference and hotel facilities at Bass Lake Road, Montano 330 multi-family dwelling units at White Rock Rd. & Latrobe Rd., Quantam Care Residential Care Facility at Carson Crossing, and Costco at Silva Valley are ongoing. New commercial construction consisting of the Gateway of El Dorado industrial development at Golden Foothill Parkway, Gateway multi-tenant building at Golden Foothill Parkway, and Aloft Hotel in Town Center continues to progress.

CRRD has received a total of <u>140</u> applications for permit in the month of September 2024. New home construction permit activity was the leading permit submittal type with **95** plan applications received.

MAJOR ACCOMPLISHMENTS

CRRD staff completed the following activities during the last 30 days:

- Completed 233 reviews of plans for permit.
- Completed <u>177</u> construction inspections and <u>112</u> smoke and carbon monoxide alarm inspections.
- Completed <u>32</u> fire and life safety inspections of residential and commercial occupancies.
- Completed **3** defensible space real estate transaction and vegetation complaint inspections.
- Completed 3 car seat installation trainings.

TOPIC

Staff seeks Board authorization to <u>repeal</u> Resolution 2024-04 entitled *Resolution Adopting Development Fees* passed on March 21, 2024.

SUMMARY

Resolution 2024-04 entitled *Resolution Adopting Development Fees* was passed on March 21, 2024. The Department had previously retained DTA to prepare a Fire Development Impact Fee Justification Study and a Fire Development Impact Fee Implementation Plan.

After the Board of Directors passed the Resolution, the Department reviewed the DTA study with El Dorado County, and we decided to stop the advancement of the new fee study to the El Dorado County Board of Supervisors.

We decided that it was in the Department's best interest to complete a new Fire Development Impact Fee study using another company.

NBS has been retained by the Department and we are in process of starting over with a new Fire Development Impact Fee Study.

Throughout this process, the Department has remained in compliance with California Government Code Section 66000 et. seq., and El Dorado County Ordinance Code Chapter 13.20 allow the District to impose development fees to mitigate the impacts of new development.

Resolution 2017-32 passed on December 21, 2017, was in place immediately prior to Resolution 2024-04. Resolution 2017-32 will continue to be the Resolution in place until the new NBS study is completed and the Board of Directors passes a new resolution adopting the NBS study.

FISCAL IMPACT

There is no fiscal impact as a result of repealing Resolution 2024-04 entitled *Resolution Adopting Development Fees* passed on March 21, 2024.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends the Board <u>repeal</u> Resolution 2024-04 entitled *Resolution Adopting Development Fees* passed on March 21, 2024.

EL DORADO HILLS COUNTY WATER DISTRICT RESOLUTION 2024-04 RESOLUTION ADOPTING DEVELOPMENT FEES

WHEREAS, the Board of Directors (hereinafter referred to as "Board") of the El Dorado Hills County Water District (hereinafter referred to as "District") recognizes that continuing residential, commercial, industrial and institutional development within the District places added responsibilities and costs upon the District; and

WHEREAS, new development will enjoy the benefits of existing facilities and equipment and will result in the need for additional facilities and equipment to maintain existing levels of service; and

WHEREAS, the District's Annual Report of Revenues and Expenditures and the adopted Five-Year Findings Report provide, among other things, a report regarding existing facilities and equipment, call loads and response times, and a projection of future growth, the impacts associated therewith, and the facilities and equipment, which in the professional opinion of the District, will be necessary to serve projected growth while maintaining existing levels of service; and

WHEREAS, existing levels of service within the District are measured, among other ways, in terms of emergency response times, firefighter to population ratios, facility and apparatus capacities and capabilities, training and readiness standards, and the types and quality of services provided; and

WHEREAS, in order to maintain existing levels of service, new development must contribute development fees toward the cost of acquiring additional facilities and equipment necessary to mitigate the impacts of growth and maintain the existing levels of service; and

WHEREAS, California Government Code Section 66000 et. seq., and El Dorado County Ordinance Code Chapter 13.20 allow the District to impose development fees to mitigate the impacts of new development; and

WHEREAS, since 1987, the District has collected development fees as a necessary element of its financial ability to serve the needs of a growing District; and

WHEREAS, the Board has reviewed the financial plans and facilities plans of the District, including the Five Year Plan adopted in FY 20/21 and prepared by SCI Consulting Group, and the staff report pertaining hereto, and has determined it to be necessary to continue the collection of said fees in the amount set forth hereinbelow; and

WHEREAS, the District retained DTA to prepare a Fire Development Impact Fee Justification Study and a Fire Development Impact Fee Implementation Plan, each of which has been submitted to and reviewed by the Board; and

WHEREAS, the Board provided an opportunity for public comment upon the Fire Development Impact Fee Justification Study and the Fire Development Impact Fee Implementation

Plan at its March Board meeting and at this meeting and has conducted a public hearing as required by law prior to adopting the Development Fees contemplated hereby; and

WHEREAS, after considering input from District staff and the public and the information contained in the Fire Development Impact Fee Justification Study and the Fire Development Impact Implementation Plan, and based upon the experience and judgment of members of the Board of Directors, the Board hereby adopts the following resolution;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that there be continued in effect a Development Fee as a condition of any building permit for the development of any residential, commercial, institutional, or industrial use within the El Dorado Hills County Water District.

Section 1. Definitions.

"Residential Use" means any use for residential purposes, including agricultural uses with a residence, as defined in the El Dorado County Zoning Code.

"Commercial/Industrial Use" means any use for commercial or industrial purposes as defined in the El Dorado County Zoning Code.

"Institutional Use" means any use for charitable, educational, hospital, church purposes, to the extent such use is not also considered as agricultural, commercial, residential, or industrial under the El Dorado County Zoning Code.

Section 2. Development Impact Fee Amount.

Section 3. Credit for Fees Paid. If Mitigation Fees were previously paid to the District by the developer or his predecessor for parcel splits within the District, the fee herein described shall be waived up to the amount previously paid.

Section 4. Determination of Fee. The Development Impact Fees set forth above in Section 2 have been determined as detailed in the Fire Development Impact Fee Justification Study by totaling the value of existing District facilities and apparatus and the District's projected cost of apparatus and facilities needs caused by new development, divided by the total projected square

footage of residential, industrial, commercial and institutional building over the next five (5) years, based upon the average historical growth rate of the District during the immediately preceding five (5) years. The imposition of Development Impact Fees upon a square footage basis is determined to be the most fair and accurate allocation of costs to be incurred to mitigate the impacts of growth.

Section 5. Development Expenditures Limitations. The Development Impact Fees collected by the District shall be kept in a separate fund and used to provide additional facilities and equipment to maintain the existing levels of service within the District; provided, however, funds collected from residential construction for facilities may only be used if an account has been established and funds appropriated for such and for which the District has adopted a proposed construction schedule or plan or said fees are used to reimburse the District for expenditures previously made. The facilities, apparatus, equipment and fee methodology are more fully detailed in the Fire Development Impact Fee Justification Study, which is annually reviewed, updated and adopted by the District Board from time to time.

Section 6. CPI Adjustment to Fee. The Development Impact Fee shall be adjusted annually on or about the anniversary of adoption of this Resolution by the then most recent Consumer Cost Index (CCI) based upon the Building Cost Index (BCI) average for San Francisco and Los Angeles as produced by the Engineering News Record.

Section 7. Appeals. Any person may appeal the imposition of these development fees by filing a statement of appeal outlining the facts and circumstances which the appellant believes are sufficient to justify the waiver of development fees as applied to the appellant's property. The District's Board will consider the appeal at its next Board meeting scheduled not less than seventy-two (72) hours from and after receipt of the written appeal.

RESOLUTION NO. 2017-32 OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE EL DORADO HILLS COUNTY WATER DISTRICT DECEMBER 21, 2017

RESOLUTION APPROVING THE EL DORADO HILLS FIRE DEPARTMENT FIRE IMPACT FEE NEXUS STUDY AND REQUESTING THE COUNTY OF EL DORADO BOARD OF SUPERVISORS ADOPT AND IMPLEMENT THE PROPOSED FIRE IMPACT FEE PROGRAM ON BEHALF OF THE DEPARTMENT

WHEREAS, AB 1600 was adopted and codified in California Government Code Section 66000 allowing the establishing, increasing or imposing of a development fee as a condition of approval where the purpose and use of the fee were identified, and reasonable relationship to the development project was demonstrated; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors ("County Board") of the County of El Dorado ("County"), by Ordinance Number 5057, amending Chapter 13, Section 20 of the County Code authorizes the imposition of development impact fees ("Fire Impact Fees") on behalf of fire agencies on new development with the unincorporated area of the County; and

WHEREAS, the El Dorado Hills County Water District ("District") Board of Directors ("District Board") desires to establish a new Fire Impact Fee program to fund fire protection facilities, apparatus and equipment necessary to mitigate the impacts caused by new development; and

WHEREAS, the El Dorado Hills County Water District ("District") Board of Directors ("Board") has received and considered the El Dorado Hills Fire Department ("Department") Fire Impact Fee Nexus Study prepared by SCI Consulting Group dated October 2017 Final Report v1.1 ("Nexus Study") that provides the required information to establish a new Fire Impact Fee program.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED that:

- 1) The District Board hereby receives and approves the Fire Impact Fee Nexus Study ("Nexus Study") dated October 2017 Final Report v1.1 by SCI Consulting Group.
- 2) Prior to the adoption of this Resolution, the District conducted a public hearing at which oral and written presentations were made, as part of the District's regularly scheduled December 21, 2017, meeting. Notice of the time and place of the meeting, including a general explanation of the matter to be considered, has been published twice in the local newspaper. Additionally, at least 10 days prior to the meeting the District made available to the public, data indicating the amount of the cost, or estimated cost, required to provide the service for which the fee or service charge is to be adjusted pursuant to the Resolution by way of such public meeting, the District received the Nexus Study attached as Exhibit A, which formed the basis for the action taken pursuant to this Resolution.

- 3) After considering the Nexus Study, this Resolution, and after considering the testimony received at this public hearing, the District, hereby makes the following findings;
 - a) The Fire Impact Fee program and Fire Impact Fees proposed in the Nexus Study and approved pursuant to this Resolution are for the purposes of funding the cost of fire protection and emergency response facilities, apparatus, and equipment attributable to new residential and nonresidential development in the Department; and
 - b) The Fire Impact Fees proposed in the Nexus Study and approved pursuant to this Resolution will be used to expand the Department's facilities and equipment, and replace and expand the Department's apparatus and vehicles to serve new development; and
 - c) The uses of the Fire Impact Fees proposed in the Nexus Study and approved pursuant to this Resolution are reasonably related to the types of development projects on which the fees are imposed in that fee revenue from the development projects will be used to expand the Department's facilities and equipment, and replace and expand the Department's apparatus and vehicles to meet the additional demand generated by the new residents and employees and new structural area created by the development projects; and
 - d) The Fire Impact Fees proposed in the Nexus Study and approved pursuant to this Resolution bear a reasonable relationship to the need for fire protection and emergency response facilities, apparatus, and equipment in that each development project will create additional need for the Department's fire protection and emergency response services and a corresponding need for new or expanded facilities, apparatus, and equipment. The fee will be imposed on different types of development projects in proportion to the additional service population generated and structural area created by new development projects; and
 - e) The Nexus Study demonstrates that there is a reasonable relationship between the amount of the Fire Impact Fee and the cost of the fire protection facilities, apparatus and equipment attributable to the development on which the fee is imposed in that the costs are based upon the level of existing development served by the Department's existing fire protection facilities and applied proportionately to nine land use categories in proportion to the need they create for expanded fire facilities, apparatus, and equipment.
- 4) The District finds pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA"), this action is not a "project" because the Resolution provides a mechanism for funding fire protection and emergency response facilities, apparatus, and equipment but does not involve a commitment to any specific project for such purposes that may result in a potentially significant impact on the environment. (CEQA Guidelines § 15378.)

5) The District does hereby approve the following Fire Impact Fees on new development which shall be collected upon issuance of a building permit:

6) If any portion of this Resolution is found by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such finding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Resolution.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that by the Board of Directors of the El Dorado County Water District formally requests that the El Dorado County Board of Supervisors adopt and implement this approved Fire Impact Fees program on behalf of the District.

EL DORADO HILLS COUNTY WATER DISTRICT RESOLUTION 2024-18 RESOLUTION TO REPEAL PREVIOUSLY ADOPTED RESOLUTION 2024-04 ADOPTING DEVELOPMENT FEES

WHEREAS, the El Dorado Hills County Water District (Department) previously retained DTA to prepare a Fire Development Impact Fee Justification Study and a Fire Development Impact Fee Implementation Plan;

WHEREAS, on March 21, 2024, the Board of Directors of the El Dorado Hills County Water District passed and adopted Resolution 2024-04 adopting Development Fees based upon the DTA Study;

WHEREAS, after the Board of Directors passed the Resolution, the Department further reviewed the DTA study with El Dorado County, and decided to suspend the advancement of the new fee study to the El Dorado County Board of Supervisors;

WHEREAS, the Department decided that it was in the Department's best interest to complete a new Fire Development Impact Fee study using another company;

WHEREAS, NBS has been retained by the Department and is in process of preparing a new Fire Development Impact Fee Study;

WHEREAS, the Department has remained in compliance with California Government Code Section 66000 et. seq., and El Dorado County Ordinance Code Chapter 13.20 which allow the District to impose development fees to mitigate the impacts of new development;

WHEREAS, Resolution 2017-32 passed on December 21, 2017, was in place immediately prior to Resolution 2024-04.

WHEREAS, Resolution 2017-32 will remain in effect until the new NBS study is completed and the Board of Directors passes a new resolution adopting the NBS study and updated Development Impact Fee.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Directors of the El Dorado County Water District is repealing Resolution 2024-04 entitled Resolution Adopting Development Fees passed on March 21, 2024 and reinstating Resolution 2017-32.
